member the A,B,C,D,E of children's rights:



Vocabulary of Rights

A: UNIVERSAL - For ALL children, everywhere, all the time.

B: INHERENT-Your rights are there from Birth. They belong to you because you are human.

C: INALIENABLE - Rights Cannot be taken or given away. A child cannot be separated from their rights.

D: UNCONDITIONAL - Rights Do not have to be earned. Children are rights holders; this does not depend upon being responsible or good...you have your rights no matter what!

E: INDIVISIBLE - Rights are Equally important . They cannot be divided or separated. (We can prioritise in emergency situations.)


